



Dear Village Residents,

Spring is finally in the air.....a time to enjoy the beauty of our wonderful, picturesque Village! To let you in on a little secret, I know that Clare and our Village's Beautification committee are already planning some colorful surprises that will be shared and enjoyed by all during the upcoming months. Stay tuned.

Village Elections:

As you know Village elections were held at our Village Hall on March 18th. Three positions were up for our voters to decide upon and the turnout was respectable. The results were:

- Jeffrey Lindenbaum, re-elected to the position of Village Trustee
- Jeffrey Schwartzberg, re-elected to the position of Village Mayor
- Rodney Khazzam – Elected to the position of Village Trustee

Rodney Khazzam had served on the Village's Board of Zoning Appeals for more than a decade, most recently in the position of Deputy Chairman of that board. Please welcome Rodney as a Village official in his new role.

Rodney replaced Eyal Isaac, who sat as a Village Trustee for the past two years. Eyal served diligently and we are sincerely grateful and appreciative for his valuable contributions during his term.

Board Positions:

Two of our Village's Boards are looking to fill vacancies that currently exist. Specifically, the Planning Board (Chaired by Michael Feinsod) and the Board of Zoning Appeals (Chaired by Steve Halper) are both looking to fill "Alternate Member" positions that currently exist on each of their respective boards. These are important boards and important seats which have become increasingly active as new development and re-developments continue in our Village. If you have an interest in participating in roles that help shape the future of our Village, please contact Bryan Rivera, our Village Clerk, at Village Hall. He will be able to guide you and answer any questions that you may have in this regard.

Annual Meeting:

Our Village's annual meeting is coming up in two weeks, on April 13th. This is an important meeting in which a number of critical items will occur including the swearing in of newly elected Village officials, the appointment of members of various boards for upcoming terms, and a host of other far reaching decisions will be announced. Additionally, immediately following the Annual Meeting will be our monthly meeting which amongst other important agenda items, will host a public hearing for our Village's 2015/2016 Budget. Everyone is welcome to attend and participate if they so choose. Perhaps you will recall the budget that we passed last year reflected a tax decrease for all our Village property owners (we are extraordinarily proud to have been the only village in Nassau County that was able to accomplish that).

Safety and Potholes on our Village Roads:

A reminder to all, please drive cautiously throughout the village, particularly in the evenings, as the Village tends to be a bit dark and our roads, windy. Please be extra careful when walking outside, particularly in the evenings. I suggest you wear bright (perhaps reflective) clothing and consider carrying a flashlight.

Recently, some folks living near/ around the Village Hall area reached out to your Board of Trustees asking for assistance with people loitering late in the evening. As a result, the BOT decided to institute, on a trial basis, new No Parking hours in the area from 11pm to 6am to address this disturbing issue. We will continue to monitor the situation with the residents and the 3rd precinct.

Additionally, if you want to report potholes in our village, please call Bryan at Village Hall.

Roslyn Water District/ Air Strippers- Update:

Although we have not yet received formal notification from the folks at Roslyn Water District, I am reasonably certain that we will be under the same watering restrictions this year, as we were last year. As a reminder, property owners were only allowed to water for two hours (between 10pm and midnight) on odd/even days, depending upon your houses address. So as a heads up, in case your lawn irrigation contractor opens up your sprinkler system before we receive formal notification; please make sure your clocks are set accordingly.

Monthly Board Meetings:

As always, please feel free to join us at our monthly Board of Trustees meetings. It is a pleasure to see our village residents in attendance and, as always, I am attaching a copy of our (tentative) agenda for your information and consideration. Our meetings are held consistently, on the second Monday of each month, at 7:30pm, at our Village Hall.
