

Dear Residents:

Village Elections:

Our Village elections were held on March 15th for two Trustee positions, whose terms were expiring. Congratulations to the top vote getters who were Dr. Brian Feingold and Dr. Sandy Joel Siff (as a Write-in candidate). Our polls remained open all day, to allow our residents ample opportunity to vote.

Security and Safety:

As I mentioned in my last letter to you, the Board of Trustees had approved, on a trial basis, traffic signage that will prohibit entry into the Village for all traffic heading Northbound on Searingtown Road onto The Spur between 7am and 9am on weekday mornings. Additionally, “No Outlet” signs were installed at Diana’s Trail and North Branch points of entry to discourage traffic flow into the Village, in general. That signage is now in place and we will closely monitor the results, in order to determine if there are any considerable changes to traffic patterns during weekday mornings.

Our local Police Department is aware of the new signage and we have requested additional and targeted police presence and enforcement to reinforce these actions.

Dogs on Leashes:

A reminder that our Village law requires all dogs to be leashed when off their own private property. Of particular note is that we have seen instances lately where dog owners have installed electronic fencing around their property’s perimeter, but have not activated the system. And as a result, some unleashed dogs have wandered off their properties. This can be dangerous to your dogs as well as to others.

Village Speed Limit:

The Board of Trustees and I are working closely with NYS Senator Jack Martins and NYS Assemblywoman Michelle Schimel in a dedicated effort to reduce the speed limit in our Village from 30 mph to 25 mph. This is not an easy task and will take a change in NYS legislation. In fact, I do not expect to receive a decision for several months. I just wanted to keep everyone “in the know”.

Road Grant Money:

Speaking of Senator Martins, I am pleased to inform you that our Village has received approval from New York State (through the State and Municipal Facilities Program) for a Road improvement grant in the amount of \$50,000.00. I spoke to Senator Martins just a few months ago about this and he has succeeded in

championing this on behalf of our Village. I am personally quite grateful to him for his efforts.

Village Boards:

As you know, our village has three important boards in addition to your Board of Trustees: Architectural Review Board (ARB); Planning Board (PB); Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA). These boards are comprised entirely of volunteers who live in our Village and they are critical to our success. If you have any interest in receiving information about their specific functions or perhaps, in getting involved, please reach out to the Village staff who will be able to address your questions and provide helpful information.

Tree Trimming:

PSE&G of Long Island has informed us that they will be conducting extensive tree trimming work around power lines throughout our Village during a three week period beginning April 7th. This should result in fewer power outages during severe weather conditions. Please drive with extra care as their trucks and crews will be scattered about our village.

Local Event of Interest:

On Wednesday, April 20th, at 7:30pm at the Atria, 99 Landing Road, Roslyn, there is a free lecture being held by author Bob Mackay on “Long Island’s Early 20th Century Planned Communities”. A chapter of the book concerns the original developer of Roslyn Estates, Dean Alvord. It should be an interesting event for those interested in the history of Long Island and our Village.
