

Dear Village Residents,

With Veterans Day fast approaching, I wish to thank all our veterans for their much appreciated service to our nation. And a Happy Thanksgiving to all!

Also, a reminder that this Tuesday is Election Day for elected officials running for offices in both the Town of North Hempstead and Nassau County. Please exercise your right and place your vote. It is simple. For our Village you will either vote at Village Hall or at Roslyn High School from 6am to 9pm. Please contact the Nassau County Board of Elections for your polling place at 516-571-8683.

This past week, I met with the newly appointed Commanding Officer of Nassau County's Third Police Precinct, Inspector John Berry. We had a good, substantive and informative meeting and began a relationship which I intend to continue. Following that meeting, it seemed to me that it would be a good idea if I focused this Mayor Letter on the Safety and Security of our residents and property. And so that is the sole message in this letter to you. Some items to consider:

- If you leave your cars parked in your driveway, please lock them and do not place valuables clearly in sight.
- If you have a house alarm, use it. If not, consider installing one as it is a valuable deterrent.
- Exterior lighting during the evening hours should be used.
- Speeding in the Village continues to be a concern and is one of the biggest complaints I receive. I have requested increased enforcement in the Village, especially during rush hours. Please be respectful of your neighbors and for the safety of everyone, respect the traffic laws.
- A reminder to always use the "dial 911" system. It is the most effective tool for the Police to track a call and for you to be able to follow up.
- At the last meeting of your Board of Trustees, we invited in the Fire Chiefs from both the Roslyn Rescue, and Roslyn Hook and Ladder Co. Fire Departments, to discuss their procedures for responding to emergencies in our Village. We seem to be in very good hands; however, both Fire Companies need volunteers. If you are looking for a meaningful way to give back to your community, please contact them.

Lastly, as you know it is getting darker, earlier. If you notice any street lights that are inoperable, please call Village Hall and report the outages.
