

Eyal will be filling a Trustee seat recently vacated by Stacy Carus who served in this capacity for the past two years. Previously she had served on our village's Zoning Board. Many thanks to Stacy for her years of wonderful and dedicated service to our village and from my point of view, for doing an excellent job for our community.

Special Recognition Award: At the March meeting of your Board of Trustees, Bob Zucker was recognized for his many years of valuable and dedicated service to our village.....in fact, Bob served our village for more than half a century! Also, the Fenway preserve is a main focus of our "post storm" cleanup activities. You might want to take a drive by there to see what progress is being made to restore this important and highly visible natural resource, strategically located in our village.
