

Dear Residents:

The Blizzard of 2016 is one that we will all remember for a long time to come. It seems to have made the list of the five worst storms since records have been kept, going back nearly 150 years. Our Village, although hit quite hard, fared reasonably well, all things considered. No reported power outages and roads all cleared by Sunday, midday. Our Village crew worked non-stop through the weekend to ensure the roads were cleared as soon as possible and our residents remained safe. The storm was a bit more intense than our equipment was able to handle, our trucks got stuck several times during the storm and we quickly moved to enlist the services of an outside contractor, who responded quickly and capably.

I want to extend my deep and sincere gratitude to all who assisted in this endeavor as well as our Village residents who reached out to me throughout the storm with important information that was helpful to ensure our resources were directed most effectively. Also, for everyone’s safety, please make sure the area around fire hydrants are kept clear, to allow access in the event of an emergency.

Village Elections

As always, our Village elections will be held in March. As a reminder, this year two Village Trustee positions are up for election. Please exercise your right to vote on Election Day. You can do so conveniently at Village Hall on Tuesday, March 15th. Our polls will be opened all day, from 6:00 am until 9:00pm.

Security and Safety

To keep everyone “in the know”, we have initiated actions to reduce our Village speed limit, from 30 miles per hour to 25 miles per hour. To do so, we have asked our State representatives to support this effort by introducing bills in the State Assembly and Senate. This is proceeding and we are hopeful to be able to implement this Village improvement shortly. I will keep you informed as we learn more. In the meantime, please drive with extra care.

Property Taxes

Our Village staff is finalizing the Tentative Tax Assessment Roll (for our Village portion of your property taxes) for the 2016/2017 tax year. That information will be available at Village Hall as well as on our website, this Monday, February 1st. Tax Grievances will only be received by the Village up through February 16th.
