



Please Drive with Extra Care as you drive through our Village!

Dear Village Residents,

Drive carefully and don't forget to put your Flags out in celebration of the July Fourth Holiday!

Watering Restrictions Continue: Similar to last year, our Village has been notified by the Roslyn Water District that lawn irrigation will only be permitted on alternating days (depending upon your house number) during the hours of 10:00pm and 12 midnight. Please be mindful of that and make sure you have your timer set accordingly.

Rear Entrance to Christopher Morley Park: You may have noticed that the opening to Christopher Morley Park near our Village Hall, which had been open for years, has been closed off. I have sent a letter to Nassau County asking them to reconsider.

Village Tax Bills: A note to let you know that Village Taxes were due no later than July 1, 2015.

Dog Poop: Continuing to remind all of our Village residents that our laws require all owners to pick up after their dogs. In consideration of your neighbors, please do not forget to do so.

Electronics: Our Carting Contractor reminds us that New York State recently passed legislation prohibiting residents from disposing electronics equipment in the trash or at curbside for pick up. These items will have to be brought to the Town of North Hempstead for recycling, please contact the Town at 311 for more information.

Safety: Let's not forget that the topography of our Village is unique with its hills, long and winding roads and curves that limit visibility. The combination of these conditions are often challenging for drivers...for pedestrians...for our youngsters riding their bicycles, scooters and skate boards. Please drive with great care. Additionally, let's also be cognizant of the fact that these conditions can create unusual and often difficult hazards for our youngsters, who are reminded to always wear protective clothing and headgear when riding in the Village.

Security: As the weather has gotten more pleasant, and doors and windows tend to be opened more often and freely, I want to remind all residents to be aware of the need to maintain generally good practices relative to protecting your family and securing and your property. Once again, I am attaching a simple list of items for your information and use.

Trees/ More Safety:

Our village is blessed with an incredible array of large, mature, magnificent and often majestic trees of numerous varieties. While these are an obvious blessing and we go to great lengths to protect their longevity, they can also be of great danger if not properly cared for. A simple limb that breaks away

from its main tree branch or tree trunk, can easily cause severe property damage, human injury or even worse. Please care for your trees. Protect them as a valuable asset and minimize the chances of regrettable mishaps.
