

Dear Residents:

Welcome back to summer! I hope you all have had some time to get out and enjoy the warm weather. And don't forget, please be mindful of our children (and your neighbors, of course) and drive carefully through our Village.

I will not take much of your time but there are a few items that you should be aware of:

**Village Taxes:**

Village tax bills, for the 2016/17 Fiscal Year, were recently mailed to either you or your tax service companies. They are due by no later than July 1st. If you need a copy of your tax bill or have any questions please contact Bryan or Sandy at our Village Hall.

**Security and Safety:**

The “No Right Turn” signage recently installed on Searingtown Road, for northbound traffic at The Spur intersection, seems to have helped reduce the amount of cars and trucks cutting through the Village. The police have done an outstanding job of enforcing this area and I expect they will continue to do so. With continued enforcement, our village will be a safer village for all to enjoy.

Additionally, we plan to install, (also on a trial basis) “No Right Turn” signs that prohibit southbound traffic that has entered the village at The Locusts, from turning onto The Oaks or The Birches during the evening rush hours (4-6pm). This, of course, is intended to discourage motorists from cutting through the Village in the afternoon. Once installed we will monitor that location and request enforcement from our local Police. While we understand this may cause some inconvenience to our residents, we also firmly believe that will be a small price to pay for the anticipated benefits, namely, “improved safety”.

**Dogs on Leashes:**

Once again I cannot stress the importance of keeping your dogs leashed whenever they are off your own property. Village law requires that. There have been numerous complaints of unleashed dogs and, in fact, some cases of dogs attacking other dogs. For the safety of everyone, including pets, please ensure that you always have control of your dogs, as this can be dangerous to all involved.

**Sumps:**

We have been informed that Nassau County's Department of Public Works has pre-treated the sumps (drainage basins) in our Village and the surrounding catch basins to kill off mosquito larvae. With the concerns of West Nile and Zika Viruses, this is certainly important and welcomed news, and should prove helpful as a preventative measure. For concerns with mosquitos, you can contact the County directly at 516-571-6900.
